Uniform Policy

Under the Education (General Provisions) Act 2006 the wearing of the correct school uniform is mandatory as per the School's Enrolment Agreement. It is the policy of this school to implement a student dress code that will:

- Maximise student access to, and participation in, all educational experiences.
- Enhance student safety by ready identification of members of the student body.
- Ensure health and safety requirements according to relevant legislation and policy.
- Minimise harassment attributed to, and accentuated by, dress.
- Ensure that both male and female students have items of dress that allow full participation in physical activities.
- Minimise stereotypical ideas about appropriateness for female and male students.
- Promotes a supportive environment at the school by fostering a sense of belonging and school spirit.

The P&C Association of Park Lake State School resolves that it supports this Student Dress Code.

We believe that by encouraging students to wear a school uniform promotes:

- a supportive environment fostering a sense of belonging;
- an effective teaching and learning environment by eliminating the distraction of competition in dress and fashion at school;
- mutual respect among individuals at school by minimising visible evidence of economic, class or social difference.

As a school community we are aware that a variety of genuine cultural, medical and religious beliefs impact upon this dress code and discussion between the Principal and caregivers of students regarding any situation will aim to negotiate a compromise.

The student dress code applies to students when:

- attending or representing the school;
- travelling to and from school;
- engaging in school activities out of hours including school excursions





UNIFORM

Sports uniform

- Park Lake SS polo shirt
- Black shorts or skorts
- Black shoes (leather or joggers) with black laces, buckles or velcro straps
- Ankle socks in white or black



Dress uniform

MUST be worn for all excursions, and performances outside of the school, school photo day, awards day and graduation day unless specified otherwise. Exceptions would be school camps or the senior students attending sports competition days with other schools.

- Park Lake SS check unisex shirt
- Black shorts or skorts
- Black shoes, leather or joggers, with black laces, buckles or velcro straps (no white laces)
- Ankle socks in plain white or black



Hat

 Park Lake SS or plain black sun safe school hat is compulsory (no caps)

UNIFORM

Additions to the uniform

- Park Lake SS or plain black jumper/jacket (no hood)
- Plain black tracksuit pants (no jeans, no leggings)
- Black tights (full length with feet) may be worn during colder months underneath skorts/shorts. No socks are required if wearing tights.
- Hair ribbons/clips in schools colours (blue/black/white). No other coloured hair accessories.

Athletics and Swimming carnivals

- Students may wear a plain sun safe shirt in their house colour
- For swimming lessons and carnivals students are to wear a rash shirt and appropriate swim wear.
- The venues expect that students will wear a swimming cap.

Nail polish/make up and jewellery

- No coloured nail polish or makeup is permitted
- One pair of plain studs or sleepers may be worn in the earlobes only
- One watch
- Items identifying medical conditions allowed
- Religious or cultural necklaces may be worn underneath uniforms with school permission
- No other jewellery items may be worn to school, including bracelets, bangles, anklets, or other body piercings.

Kids love the tuckshop so it's a pretty busy place to be. To make sure we can provide continued service to our kids, we rely on our wonderful volunteers to help!



Who can help?

Anyone can help ... mums, dads, grandparents and friends. All training, recipes and coffee supplied!

No need to stay all day!

We understand how busy our parents are so we have a number of volunteering options available to suit everyone!

- 15-20 mins after school drop off to stick Flexischools labels on bags or to cut up fruit and salad items, wash lettuce etc
- 1 hour once a week to make muffins and cookies, pasta bolognese, fried rice or butter chicken
- 1 hour once a month to do the stocktake (bring a friend)
- Special cultural dishes that you'd be willing to make for theme days to allow the students to experience something new
- Or just come in and lend a hand!
